GOOD EVENING EVERYONE AND WELCOME TO OUR AGM

As you are aware, our clubhouse has been under renovation works throughout the last year. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our architect Shay Scanlon for his endless hours of dedication to the project and to Paul Pender of PP Construction and all other local contractors for their work which result in the facilities we host our AGM in tonight.

2015 was a busy and productive year on and off the field for the club. The first phase of our development is complete will hopefully the second phase of development of the club facilities to get underway in 2016. On the pitch, our Senior Team had a topsy-turvy year. While defeating neighbours Summerhill in the second round of the Championship, we recorded only one other victory, that against Duleek/Bellewstown, while the other three games of the group stage saw heavy defeats being shipped at the hands of Wolfe Tones, St. Peter's Dunboyne & Rathkenny. The Div. 2 A League saw us struggle to find results for most part of the year while the latter stages saw us pick up enough points to avoid relegation trouble. Our Junior 'B' Team progressed from the Group stages to lose out to Slane in a Quarter Final in the Championship. In the B League Moynalvey had a reasonably successful campaign finishing mid Table in Div. 3.

Underage teams and the Ladies Team also competed well in their respective competitions, more on these later.

Well done to Padraic Harnan, Mark O'Sullivan and Darren Brennan earlier in the year who represented the club at County Senior Level, Shane Lenehan, Padraic Harnan & Brian Harnan who represented the club at County U-21 level and Conor Harnan who represented the club at Minor Grade for the County. We also had a Moynalvey clubman Denis O'Shea in charge of the Meath Minor Footballers; with another Moynalvey man Paul Conneely forming part of Denis' back room team.

"Stop being afraid of what could go wrong and start being positive about what could go right"











UNDER-15

Joe Murphy, Tomas McCabe, John Deegan and Dara Voyles looked after this age group in the Autumn.

UNDER 16 AND UNDER 18 -JENKINSTOWN GAELS

At minor level Padraig Donoghue was lead coach assisted from Moynalvey by Fintan Lawless. There were 24 in the panel altogether (50/50 split Moynalvey and Blackhall Gaels). We had five under 18, four under 17 and three under 16s playing. Jenkinstown played at division 2 in the league with approx 16-17 at every match. We had a good run in the championship and we were beaten by Oldcastle in the final. Five under 16s played that day.

The U16s competed well in the league but found the going tough especially against teams like Dunboyne. Tom McCabe kindly mentored this team on behalf of Moynalvey.

Summary of the Coiste Na Nog and Coiste Fe-18 Meeting held last Thursday 7th January 3 key points from the meeting:

1. Leinster GAA are introducing Meath /Kildare competitions where it is likely that clubs will join up to field teams in these competitions. This initiative is being introduced because of reports that currently many clubs play the same few neighbours repeatedly. This will provide challenging inter-county competition against new opponents. It was suggested that clubs with low numbers might have to amalgamate to field teams. (Jenkinstown model leading the way!).

Dates for the U-16 competition have already been circulated.

2. U17s not allowed play at senior level.

In the future, it is likely that minor competitions will be replaced by U-17.

In addition, there were suggestions that U-14 cannot play U-16 and that two-year rule applies through all ages. The background thinking is to ensure that weaker players all get to play at their age group and are not dropped in favour of a whiz underage younger player!

This was rejected heavily by clubs who said they could not field teams with this rule in place.

3. Coaches in clubs;

Gerry McEntee and John O'Loughlin (Laois midfielder) addressed the meeting, describing how 55 full time coaches operate through Dublin clubs, half of the wages funded by clubs and half by Sports Ireland. John is such a coach in the St Bridget's club area and he goes into the six feeder schools very regularly coaching boys and girls in hurling and football. These employed coaches then mentor the other existing club coaches and oversee their coaching programs. They also facilitate Saturday blitz activity during the year.

Gerry suggested that smaller neighbouring clubs could pool resources to make this happen and there is a need for political help to get Sports Ireland and other key funding. This concept is well worth exploring in my opinion.

Moving Forward

Moynalvey GFC take great pride in our Juvenile section of our club. This can be attributed to all the dedication from the committee, mentors and parents.

Parental involvement is crucial moving forward. We need volunteers to help on and off the pitch. The key areas which help is required in is assisting coaches (ie sending texts, co-ordinating games, booking pitches) and the washing of jerseys.

We look forward to another great year of football for all the children.

Subscribers using Clubify will receive notifications to their handset when the club updates their App with news/fixtures/results.



A reminder of the Mandatory Coaching Standards passed by Árd Comhairle!

Mandatory Coaching Standards

Árd Chomhairle has approved the following standards for Inter-County and Club teams from 2016:

Inter County Management Teams

- By the start of the 2016 season, all Inter-County Management teams will contain an Award 2 coach. This person would ideally be the head coach. Applications for a derogation can be made to the National Games Development Committee where deemed to be in the best developmental interests of the relevant team.
- By the start of the 2018 season, all Inter-County Head Coaches will be Award 2 qualified.

Club Management Teams

- By the start of the 2016 season, all Club Management teams will contain an Award 1 coach. This person would ideally be the head coach.
- By the start of the 2018 season, all Club Head Coaches will be Award 1 qualified.

The following initiatives have been prioritised to support the roll out of these standards across the Association.

- 1. The delivery mechanisms for the GAA Coach Education Programme to be expanded to include Online (learning.gaa.ie), Communities of Practice and Mentoring.
- 2. Recognition of relevant competencies gained through non-GAA programmes or internal programmes, currently not formally linked to the GAA Coach Education Programme, will be facilitated and quality assured.
- 3. An assimilation programme will be established to recognise the competencies of managers and coaches who have gained experience and expertise without gaining GAA CEP qualifications to date.
